In this context, we anticipate greater programmatic exchange, broadcasting of series and documentaries about Arab countries and China, and encouragement of joint production to deepen the bond between the two ancient civilisations. The authenticity of the two civilisations is evident in the writings of historians, geographers, and travellers, prime among whom is Moroccan traveller Ibn Batuta, who visited China, including Hangzhou, in the 14th century.

The recent conflict in the Gaza Strip underscored the biased stance of certain Western media components, repeatedly emphasising the Israeli narrative of self-defence while overlooking the legitimate Palestinian right to national independence, freedom, and dignity. The destruction of facilities, the targeting of civilians, including journalists, and the sacrifice of over 70 journalists in their pursuit of truth are blatant violations of international humanitarian law that mandates the protection of journalists.

In conclusion, I express my sincere thanks to the organisers of this forum, applauding the earnest efforts of all partners from ministries and media institutions to develop Arab-Chinese relations in various media fields, particularly in radio and television. I wish the forum complete success in its endeavours.
